#### Arthur Conan Doyle Famous Writer

Arthur Conan Doyle was a British writer and physician, born in Edinburgh, Scotland on May 22, and died on July 7, 1930, in Crowborough, England. Arthur Conan Doyle created the very famous character-Sherlock Holmes, a talented, gifted detective.

Conan Doyle's first Sherlock Holmes story," A Study in Scarlet" was published in Beeton's Christmas Annual, in the year 1887. Starting in 1891, the series of Sherlock Holmes appeared in the Strand Magazine and Conan Doyle was able to assign himself to write. Once published, Conan Doyle's books instantly became extremely

famous over the world, since it was and still is, one of the world's greatest detectives. After Arthur Conan Doyle's death, his wife Jean Elizabeth inherited his wealth. After her death, Conan Doyle's oldest son, Denis Conan Doyle gladly gave his beloved wife, Nino Mdivani, who was a Georgian woman the exclusive right to publishing his father's works. Nino thankfully accepted the offer and excitedly got to publishing Arthur's books and stories.

#### Righteous Ilia the great Poet

Today I am going to discuss a very famous Georgian writer and poet. Now, many of you thought that I was going to talk about Vazha-Pshavela. Because I think that everyone who lives in Georgia has heard of Vazha-Pshavela regardless if you are Georgian or not. But I am going to be talking about Prince Ilia Chavchavadze. He was a Georgian public figure, journalist, publisher, writer, and poet. He was highly involved in Georgian politics and had a huge influence on the people.

He fought for his people, language, culture, and religion. He fought very hard to protect his people from Russification. He was ultimately killed for it.

He advocated for capital punishment to end. He most famously advocated for the Georgian population to become literate. He did this in many ways, he was the founder of two modern newspapers: Sakartvelos Moambe and Iveria. He also participated in founding the first NGO-type organization in Georgian schools. "Society for the Spreading of Literacy among Georgians" as the name of this organization. What made this organization so special was that they provided education in Georgian instead of Russian. He put into place very important measures that were key to halting the Russification policy of the Russian Empire in Georgia.

He also introduced The Georgian populous to liberal Western ideas. He also advocated for the rights of women. and his personal opinions on the judicial system, social issues, human rights, women rights, economics, education, and civic activism helped to create a modern sense of self for the Georgian people. He is considered the main contributor to Georgian cultural and civic nationalism. Chavchavadze was killed in Tsitsamuri, outside Mtskheta, by assassins. The exact reason and details for his murder have been up for Debate and still debatable. He was canonized as Saint Ilia the Righteous (δθηδων ηφην θνήσην, tsminda ilia martali) In the Georgian Orthodox church in 1987.

The reason why I'm telling you about his story is that his literature has impacted me in a great way. Although I am not a Georgian and I do not fully understand what this country has been through, his literature and life have opened my mind to a small portion of what has happened here. I would read at least one of his poems. Some of his most famous works include The Hermit, The Ghost,Otaraant Widow, Kako The Robber, Happy Nation, Letters of a Traveler and Is a man a human?!.



## **Economics Section**

#### Rethinking if GDP really measures society's well-being and standards of living

GDP per capita is considered to be the main indicator of the average person's standard of living. However, Economists (and I) have debated how good measure it is for living standards.

Yes, GDP calculates the income of the people, and the value of all final goods & services produced within a country, But what

about our health, education, or happiness?

GDP doesn't measure levels of education, health, life expectancy, freedom, sense of security, peacefulness, working hours, and leisure time balance, stress, happiness, crime rate, and other factors that determine society's well-being and standards of living.

GDP doesn't track the value of negative externalities, such as pollution, and toxic wastes, neither depletion of natural resources.

These factors definitely result in reducing society's well-being.

Most importantly, GDP per capita can't provide information about the distribution. For instance, Nigeria has a higher average GDP than Honduras, yet in Nigeria, around 80% of the population lives on less than \$2 a day, while in Honduras the same applies to 35%!

In favor of GDP, economists will legitimately argue that the GDP is positively and linearly correlated with some factors we care about. According to statistics, the higher GDP per capita, the higher is the life expectancy, the education level, and the satisfaction level.

Obviously, GDP is very useful, but it is not the perfect indicator for a country's well-being!

And if you want to see the battle of Gross National Happiness and Human Development Index, fighting to become the world's best measure of well-being, wait for the next article in ES Monthly.


